Jenkins won 26 of 35 face-offs as the Cannons snapped a two-game losing streak with a 19-14 victory over Los Angeles ... He also added a game-high 13 ground balls ... Jenkins has a league-high 31 ground balls this season and has won 61 of 108 draws.



GOALKEEPER OF THE WEEK

Gabel made 19 saves, including 11 in the fourth quarter, as the Machine earned their first-ever win ... He has stopped 52.1 per cent of the shots he has faced so far this year.

LAST WEEK'S GAME RECAPS

@ WASHINGTON 17, NEW JERSEY 16 (OT): Washington attackman **Matt Ward** scored the game-winning goal with 4:08 left in overtime as the Bayhawks won their third straight game, a 17-16 overtime victory over the New Jersey Pride at Georgetown's Multi-Sport Field ... It was the Bayhawks' third consecutive one-point decision and marked the third straight meeting between the two teams which ended in overtime ... New Jersey attackman **Scott Urlick** scored four goals to lead the Pride in the loss, including the 200th of his college career ... Washington midfielder **Kyle Dixon** scored a career-high five goals in the win and was named as the Bud Light MVP.

LONG ISLAND 14, @ SAN FRANCISCO 12: Long Island attackman **Keith Cromwell** scored two goals and added four assists to lead the Lizards to their second straight win, a 14-12 victory at San Francisco on Saturday ... The loss spoiled the Dragons' home opener at Kezar Stadium ... The Lizards overcame some difficult travel issues to earn the victory as the team did not arrive in San Francisco until 10:15 a.m. on Saturday morning ... Attackman **Tim Goettelmann** posted four goals and an assist for the Lizards while attackman **Ryan Powell** led the Dragons with a five-point effort, scoring a goal with four assists.

@ PHILADELPHIA 21, ROCHESTER 17: Attackman **Ryan Boyle** scored four goals, including a two-pointer, and added four assists to lead the defending MLL champion Barrage to a 21-17 victory over Rochester in Philadelphia's home opener at the United Sports Training Center on Saturday night ... The nine points tied a career high for Boyle and are the most recorded by a player in the MLL this season ... Midfielder **Roy Colsey** scored four goals with an assist for the Barrage while goalkeeper **Brian Dougherty** had 17 saves in the victory ... Attackman **John Grant, Jr.** paced Rochester with a six-goal effort while attackman **Casey Powell** had three goals with an assist.

@ BOSTON 19, LOS ANGELES 14: Led by a three-goal, four-assist effort from attackman **Mikey Powell**, the Boston Cannons snapped a two-game losing streak with a 19-14 victory over the Los Angeles Riptide on Saturday night ... The game set a Cannons single-game attendance record as 9,375 fans saw the game ... Rookie attackman **David Mitchell** had a solid debut for the Cannons by scoring three goals ... Midfielder **Matt Poskay** also posted a hat trick while midfielder **David Jenkins** won 26 of 35 face-offs and had a game-high 13 ground balls ... Attackman **Michael Watson** led Los Angeles with five goals and three assists while attackman **Andrew Combs** posted a four-goal effort.

@ CHICAGO 19, DENVER 17: Attackman **Athan Iannucci** scored four goals, including a two-point tally, and had two assists as the Chicago Machine earned the first victory in franchise history with a 19-17 come-from-behind win over Denver at TOYOTA Park ... The win snapped a league-record 13-game losing streak for the Machine, dating back to last season ... Iannucci was named as the Bud Light MVP after setting a team single-game record with his seven-point effort ... Goalkeeper **Mike Gabel** made 19 saves, including 11 in the fourth quarter, to lead the Chicago defense ... Denver midfielder **Jeff Sonke** scored four goals, including a two-point tally, to lead the Outlaws in the loss ... It was the Machine's first win over Denver in four all-time meetings.

NEWS AND NOTES

HOME COOKING: After dropping five of the first eight games this season, home teams won four of five games last weekend and are now 7-6 this year ... San Francisco, which dropped a 14-12 decision against Long Island, was the only team which did not win at home last week.

STAYING INSIDE: So far in 13 games this season, there have only been 14 two-point goals scored ... Washington and San Francisco have tallied four two-point goals each while Denver and Chicago have scored a two-point goal twice ... Four teams (Long Island, Philadelphia, Rochester, New Jersey) have not scored a two-point goal yet this year.

AND THEN THERE WERE TWO: Entering the fourth full week of the MLL season, there are just two teams with undefeated records as Philadelphia and Long Island have opened the season with back-to-back victories ... The Barrage defeated Rochester by a 21-17 margin last week while the Lizards earned a hard-fought 14-12 win at San Francisco.

POWER OUTAGE: Entering this week's action, MLL teams have combined for 22 power-play goals in 90 opportunities, which is good for a 27 per cent conversion rate ... The Boston Cannons have scored five extra-man goals in their first four games to lead the league while the Los Angeles Riptide has converted a league-best 50.0 per cent of their chances with the extra man ... Philadelphia has had 14 power-play opportunities in its first two games.

THE STREAK IS OVER: With their 19-17 victory over Denver on Saturday night, the Chicago Machine earned the first win in their brief two-year franchise history ... The win also snapped a league-record 13-game losing streak ... Attackman **Athan Iannucci** set a team record by recording seven points, scoring four goals, including a two-pointer, and two assists.

PLAYING THEM CLOSE: The Washington Bayhawks have won three straight games after dropping their season opener against Boston ... In addition, all three of their wins have been decided by one point, including a pair of overtime victories ... The Bayhawks overcame a three-point deficit in the fourth quarter to defeat New Jersey by a 17-16 margin on Saturday afternoon in overtime ... It was the third straight meeting between the Pride and the Bayhawks which resulted in overtime.

LUCKY SEVEN: After opening the season with a pair of victories over Rochester and Boston, the Philadelphia Barrage have won seven straight regular season games, dating back to last season ... The Barrage have won nine straight games, including the postseason ... Philadelphia ended last season with five straight wins and earned a wild card berth in New Balance MLL Championship Weekend.

TOUGH START: The New Jersey Pride have started the season with three straight losses after dropping a 17-16 overtime decision against the Washington Bayhawks on Saturday afternoon ... It is the first time in team history that the Pride have lost their first three games.

QUICK DEBUTS: Several players made their Major League Lacrosse debuts after being drafted in the MLL Collegiate Draft on Thursday night ... Chicago midfielder **Pat Heim**, who was selected as the first overall pick, scored four goals in the Machine's 19-17 victory over Denver on Saturday night ... In addition, Rochester midfielder **Alex Smith**, who was picked third overall in the draft, won 19 of 29 face-offs and also had an assist in the Rattlers' 21-17 loss at Philadelphia.

'X' MARKS THE SPOT: Boston midfielder/face-off specialist **David Jenkins** has had an outstanding start to the season ... He leads the league with 31 ground balls, including a game-high 13 in the Cannons' 19-14 victory over Los Angeles on Saturday night ... In addition, he has won 61 of 108 face-offs (.565) this year ... Jenkins was named as the Defensive Player of the Week this week after winning 26 of 35 face-offs.

THE GREAT GARRITY: Washington goalkeeper **Chris Garrity** has been one of the major reasons for the Bayhawks' success in the early part of the season ... Named as the MLL Goalkeeper of the Week last week, he has a league-high 73 saves in Washington's four games and ranks third in the MLL with a .570 save percentage ... Garrity had a career-high 27 saves in the Bayhawks' 13-12 win at Rochester two weeks ago.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER: The Washington Bayhawks have three of the top four point-scorers in Major League Lacrosse through the first three weeks of the season ... Midfielder **Kyle Dixon** leads the league with 16 points ... He has scored 11 goals, including a two-point tally, along with four assists ... Meanwhile, attackman **Matt Ward** ranks second with 15 points ... The reigning MLL Rookie of the Year has 10 goals, including a two-pointer, and four assists ... Attackman **Conor Gill**, who is tied for second in the league with eight assists, also has 15 points.

A "BUGGS" LIFE: Los Angeles Riptide attackman **Andrew "Buggs" Combs** has opened the season with three solid scoring efforts ... The MLL leader in goals, he has tallied 13 goals in the Riptide's first three games ... He opened the season with a five-goal effort against Chicago on May 19 before adding four goals and an assist against New Jersey on May 27 ... Combs had four goals in the Riptide's loss at Boston on Saturday night.

SCORING MACHINE: Chicago Machine attackman **Kevin Leveille** has scored in all 14 games in the Machine's brief two-year history and was the only player in the MLL to score in all 12 games last year ... Over the course of the last 14 games, he has scored 33 goals ... Overall, Leveille has scored in each of his last 27 games, dating back to the 2004 season.

SNAKE SIX-PACK: Rochester attackman **John Grant, Jr.** scored six goals in the Rattlers' 21-17 loss against Philadelphia on Saturday night, matching the most goals scored by a player in a game this season ... Denver Outlaws midfielder **Jeff Sonke** scored a game-high six goals in the season opener against Los Angeles on May 19.

FINALLY THERE: New Jersey attackman **Scott Urick** became the third player in Major League Lacrosse history to score 200 career goals after a four-goal effort in the Pride's 17-16 overtime loss at Washington on Saturday ... He now has 202 career goals in seven MLL seasons ... Pride teammate **Jesse Hubbard** and Washington attackman **Mark Millon** are the other players to have reached the exclusive milestone.

ALL-STAR GAME RETURNS TO BOSTON: For the second straight season, the Major League Lacrosse All-Star Game will be played in Boston ... However, the venue moves from Nickerson Field to Harvard Stadium ... The game will be played on Sunday, July 8 at 12:30 p.m. and will be televised live on ESPN2 ... In this year's game, the Eastern Conference will face the Western Conference for the first time in league history ... Led by two goals from midfielder **Kevin Cassese**, the U.S. National Team defeated the MLL All-Stars by an 18-10 margin in front of 9,234 fans at Nickerson Field last year.

FAIRFAX, Va. - Attackman **Chazz Woodson** scored a game-high four goals, including three in the first half, as the Boston Cannons (1-0, 1-0) jumped out to a 9-4 half-time lead en route to a 17-13 victory over the Washington Bayhawks (0-1, 0-1) in the MLL season opener at George Mason Stadium.
